




BSSPD 'Managing Failing Implants: How should we maintain them' Presidential editorial

Miss Margie Taylor

Born in Edinburgh and educated at James Gillespie's High School, Miss Taylor graduated from Edinburgh University in 1978. She gained an MSc in Community Medicine in 1985 and an MBA in 1996. She is a fellow in dental surgery of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Glasgow and an honorary member of the Faculty of Public Health Medicine. Miss Taylor has also held posts as Honorary Senior Lecturer at St Andrews, Glasgow and Dundee universities.

Miss Taylor has extensive experience in dentistry and is currently Consultant in Dental Public Health at NHS Lanarkshire. Before joining NHS Lanarkshire in 1994, she worked in Fife and Lothian as Chief Administrative Dental Officer and in clinical dentistry respectively. She has also held positions as board member at NHS Health Scotland between 1998 and 2006 and has chaired the dental committee at NHS National Education for Scotland for the past few years.






Prof Tomas Albrektsson

Tomas Albrektsson, MD, Ph D, ODhc, started working on oral implants with PI Branemark in the late 1960s. Prof Albrektsson is currently the Head of the Dept of Biomaterials of Göteborg University. He has presented some 800 invited lectures all over the world and published some 600 scientific papers and reviews on topics such as oral, craniofacial and orthopaedic implants, bone blood flow, bone remodelling and implant surfaces.

The Editor of 10 scientific books and the member of the Editorial Board of 8 international scientific journals. Editor-in-Chief of Applied Osseointegration Research, a scientific monograph, since 2000. Several patents in the field of biomaterials. The author of more than 600 abstracts, reviews and scientific papers on bone grafts, vital microscopy of bone, experimental implants, oral and craniofacial reconstructions and orthopaedic implants. Paper by Brånemark, Albrektsson et al (1983)was in 2006 awarded as one of the top papers published in Biomaterials during 25 years. Paper by Wennerberg & Albrektsson (2000) awarded title of best paper in Int J Oral & Maxillofacial Implants published in the year of 2000. Ranked among the 6 most quoted scientists of the Medical faculty of Göteborg University in an investigation covering the years between 1986 and 2001.



Dr Patrick Palacci

Dr. Palacci received his DDS degree from Marseilles University, France, in 1975. He continued his postgraduate education in periodontology at Boston University from 1977 to 1981 and was appointed as a visiting professor at the university in 1982. Dr. Palacci is a private practitioner in Marseilles and heads the Brånemark Osseointegration Center in Marseilles, working in very closely with Prof. P-I Brånemark. He also works in Monaco together with Professor Claude Pallanca.

He developed several techniques in relation with optimal implant positioning, papilla regeneration technique and esthetic implant dentistry. He is the author of numerous scientific articles and two textbooks published by Quintessence in 1995 and 2001. Dr. Palacci got the first Nobel Pharma Award in 1995. Dr. Palacci presently conducts a number of courses in his private clinic and has been invited as a speaker to scientific meetings all around the world.



Prof Stefan Renvert

Stefan Renvert received his D.D.S. degree from the University of Lund, Sweden, in 1975. In 1979 he spent one year as visiting professor at Loma Linda University in California, USA. He then completed graduate training in Periodontology at the Dental School in Malmö University of Lund, Sweden with a certificate in Periodontology 1981 and the Odont.Dr. (Ph.D) degree in 1984. In 1999 he became Professor of Oral Health Sciences and Research Director at Kristianstad University, Sweden. Professor Renvert also holds a position as visiting professor at Dublin Dental Hospital, Trinity College, Dublin, Ireland.





Professor Renvert's early research focused on outcome assessments of different treatment modalities of intra-osseous defects and diagnosis of periodontal diseases. His collaborative research efforts over the last years have resulted in numerous publications on periodontal microbiology, guided bone regeneration around implants, peri-implantitis and the association between periodontitis and cardiovascular diseases. Professor Renvert has published around 100 papers in international and national journals.

At present Professor Renvert's research focuses on diagnosis and treatment of peri-implantitis, risk assessments and the association of periodontal disease to the general health, especially periodontitis and its association to cardiovascular disease.



Dr Frank Schwarz

Dr Frank Schwarz is currently the Assistant Professor in the Department of Oral Surgery at the Heinrich Heine University in Duesseldorf. His doctorate focused on periodontal treatment with an ER:YAG laser and in 2002 he received the young researcher award for his work on Lasers in Dentistry, after which he worked as an Associate at the Department at the Ludwig Maximillians University in Munich.

The winner of the coveted André Schroeder Research Prize, an annual award for the advancement of dental research and development, was announced in New York by Straumann's President and CEO, Gilbert Achermann. Dr Schwarz, who is the fourteenth recipient of this prestigious prize, was selected by the independent jury for his scientific investigation of the effects of surface hydrophilicity and microtopography of titanium dental implants on soft and hard tissue integration.



Dr Stefan Ellner

Stefan Ellner, DDS, passed his Dental exam in 1982 and began implant training in 1988 and became a Board certified prosthodontist in 1999. He is a Senior consultant 1994 and Head of Department, Clinic for Prosthodontics, Specialist Dental Centre, Kalmar County Hospital, 1999. He is the principal investigator in four multicenter implant studies and lectures on both national and international basis.

He is the co-author in Cooper L et al. A multicenter 12-month evaluation of single-tooth implants restored 3 weeks after 1-stage surgery. Int J Oral Maxillofac Implants. 2001 Mar-Apr; 16 (2): 182-92.

He won the prize of "Best Scientific Article in 2003" for Ellner S, Bergendal T, Bergman B. Four Post-and-Core Combinations as Abutments for Fixed Single Crown. A Prospective up-to-10-year Study. Int J Prosthodont. 2003;16:249-254.



Mr Paul Stone

Paul has been involved with implant dentistry for more than 20 years and has placed several thousand implants over that period. He lectures both nationally and internationally, and holds senior positions on a number of representative bodies in both the UK and in Europe.

Paul is Chairman of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh Advisory Board in Implant Dentistry, President Elect of the European Association of Osseointegration (EAO), a member of the General Dental Council Working Group convened to revise the Implant Training Standards Guidelines for General Dental Practitioners. He is also a Fellow of the International Team for Implantology (ITI), and Past President of the Association for Dental Implantology (ADI).

Paul's main areas of interest lie in implant surgery and reconstruction, as well as education, training and assessment for implant dentistry





Mr John Cameron

John Cameron is the Senior Dental Adviser for NHS National Services Scotland. He has extensive medico-legal experience and has formerly been Dental Adviser for MDDUS and Local Adviser and a member of the Dental Advisory Panel for Dental Protection Ltd.

He has both dental and legal degrees, and in addition to his current work for NHS Scotland he runs a company advising health care professionals on legal problems. He has made representations at the GDC, GMC NMC and at three employment tribunals in the last year alone.

John lectures widely throughout the UK on risk management and medico-legal matters as well as having contributed to several books and publications.



Mr Karl Bishop

Following qualification from Cardiff in 1981, Karl Bishop entered general practice until 1992, and from 1984 until 1992 he was also a part-time lecturer in the Department of Restorative Dentistry at the University Dental Hospital, Cardiff. From 1992 until 1994 he was Registrar in Restorative Dentistry at Kings Dental Institute, London, and he held the post of Senior Registrar in Restorative Dentistry at Sheffield from 1994 until 1997.

At present Mr Bishop is a Consultant in Restorative Dentistry and Implantology at Morriston Hospital, Swansea and holds an Honorary Consultant's post at the University Dental Hospital, Cardiff. He is the Postgraduate Dental Tutor for South West Wales (Swansea) and has published extensively on a wide range of restorative topics.

He is also recognised by the GDC as a Specialist in Restorative Dentistry, Endodontics, Prosthodontics and Periodontology. He has a special interest in the implant rehabilitation of patients who have experienced trauma or surgery and advanced multi-speciality restorative procedures.

Mr Chris Butterworth

Chris is a consultant in Restorative Dentistry based between the regional maxillofacial unit at Aintree and the Liverpool University Dental Hospital. He is the lead clinician for dental implants at the Dental Hospital and also leads the oral rehabilitation service in Merseyside for the rehabilitation of oral cancer patients. He holds an honorary lecturer's contract with the University of Liverpool.

He has extensive experience in the treatment planning, surgical placement and restoration of dental implants. He is interested in the use of computerised dental implant planning techniques for complex cases and in quality of life outcomes following dental implant treatment.

He is a member of the Association of Dental Implantology, the British Association of Head and Neck Oncology and a council member of the BSSPD. He sits on the Specialist Advisory Committee for Restorative Dentistry at the Royal College of Surgeons of England and examines at all levels of postgraduate examinations in Restorative Dentistry. He has contributed significantly to the scientific literature and lectures on a regular basis within the UK. He sits on the Specialist Advisory Board for the Diploma in Implant Dentistry examination at the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh.





Mr Peter Briggs

Peter qualified in 1983 from King's College Hospital Dental School. He completed a MSc at the Eastman Dental Institute in 1988. He was awarded a Winston Churchill Travel Scholarship in 1994 to study oncology abroad and was appointed a Consultant in 1995. Peter was appointed Clinical Director of the Maxillo-Facial Unit at St. George's Hospital in 1997. During that time a modern Maxillo-Facial out-patient facility was commissioned, Maxillo-Facial Surgical and Dental services were re-organised within South West London with St. George's the 'Hub' centre. The Roehampton Laboratory transferred to St George's in 2006.

He has published over 40 publications and is committed to teaching and training. He is a past chair of the Specialist Training Committee and Training Programme Director. Peter is currently the Postgraduate Dental Tutor at St. George's and also has been appointed to lead the teaching team of the first Pan-London DwSI program (which is supported by 10 PCTs).

He is a present ISFE examiner and has been invited to lecture to the following groups: BDA National Conference / BDA Young Dentist Conference / Consultants in Restorative Dentistry Group / European Prosthodontic Conference / British Society of General Dental Practitioners / British Society of Restorative Dentistry / Faculty of General Dental Surgery RCS (Eng).

BSSPD President honoured in North West Innovation Awards 2009

Craig Barclay and Chris Butterworth were placed 2nd in the software category at the recent North-West Innovation Awards ceremony held in Central Manchester on the 11th November 2009.

Their entry entitled "The BORRN Head and Neck Cancer Touchscreen Database" had been shortlisted into the top four entries from a total of 24 entries in the software category.

The touchscreen database was the culmination of several years work with a significant contribution by Dr Anne Sharrock from Manchester Computing Centre. The program uses a touchscreen computer to allow patients to complete questionnaires which they would otherwise complete in paper. The program can use any number of different questionnaires which the user wishes and allows detailed data analysis.


